“Come Let Us Sing”

I believe that worship is a God-given, ingrained human emotion. Mankind has always felt the need to worship something. Whether it be “a” god or many “gods” or nature or idols; man feels compelled to worship. Paul even noticed that the Athenians had a monument to the “Unknown God”. He then used that as a spring board into a lesson on “the” God.

Psalm 95 is a psalm of worship. *“Come let us sing for joy to the Lord; let us shout aloud to the Rock of our salvation.”* Here we see that worship involves joy. Joy is an essential part of the Christian experience. It is one of the fruits of the Spirit. Paul encouraged the Philippians to, *“Rejoice in the Lord always”*, and then he repeated himself, *“Rejoice!”*. Jesus told the disciples that their grief would give way to joy. And the writer of Hebrews said that Jesus experienced the agony of the cross, *“for the joy set before Him.”* No matter how bad our circumstances get, we have much to be joyful about. God is our Rock. Our Salvation. Nothing can take that away from us. And we have so much to look forward to. Paul said that he knew that all the trials and tribulations in this life cannot even compare to the glory that lies ahead. And so we sing for joy to the Lord.

Another part of our worship is gratitude. The psalm continues, *“Let us come before Him with thanksgiving and extol Him with music and song.”* A sour, negative, grumbling, complaining, joyless life is a sign of ingratitude to God. He has so richly blessed us and at an awful cost to Him. It’s one thing when someone gives you something that costs them nothing. It’s something altogether different when someone truly sacrifices for you. God sent His one and only Son to be the sacrifice for our sins. To pardon us. To secure for us a place in Heaven. We must never take that lightly. We must never take that for granted. We must always praise God with thanksgiving for his multitude of blessings.

Next the psalmist writes, *“For the Lord is the great God, the great King above all gods.”* That’s it! The ultimate reason for praise and worship. Our God is “the” God. Greater, higher, more awesome than any man-contrived god. At its core, our worship and praise is a simple acknowledgment of who He is. So, whether in our private devotion, or in our collective worship, *“Come, let us sing for joy to the Lord! ... For the Lord is the great God, the great King above all gods!”*

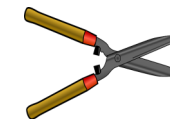


IN AREA CONVALESCENT HOMES
