"Thoughts on Thanksgiving"

We are again approaching a national time of thanksgiving. This is a celebration that goes all the way back to 1621 when the Plymouth Colony met to express their gratitude to God for a successful harvest.

As Christians, we understand that every moment is a time for gratitude and thanksgiving. If, however, more people will stop even once a year to be grateful, that is a step in the right direction.

Gratitude must always be directed toward someone or some source outside and beyond ourselves. Failure to realize this makes what we call gratitude little more than self-praise.

The source of all true blessings is well known to us. The Bible says that, "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows" (James 1:17). God is indeed the source of all that is good in our lives, both tangible and intangible.

We may sometimes fall into the habit of thinking that the things we work for everyday and obtain through personal effort are somehow all of our own making and that we should take credit for them. In ancient times, when the people started to have this very attitude, God spoke to them saying, "You may say to yourself, 'My power and the strength of my hands have produced this wealth for me.' But remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you the ability to produce wealth and so confirm his covenant, which he swore to your forefathers, as it is today" (Deuteronomy 8:18).

We can never take credit for any of our blessings. The skill, intelligence, creativity and strength to perform any worthwhile tasks are all gifts from God.

All around us there is an abundance of material blessings for which to be grateful. But even more there are the spiritual, intangible blessings: love, hope, joy, peace, forgiveness and many more.

An attitude of ingratitude is offensive to all of us. The Bible tells of the ten lepers whom Jesus cleansed. One of them turned back and, "threw himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him." And Jesus asked: "Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine?" (Luke 17:16-17)

We dare not ever be like the nine ungrateful lepers. We will see the goodness of the Lord all about us. We will see and be grateful.
