I know that we have all been anxiously awaiting the time when we could begin to worship together in person again. Below is the "tentative" schedule for re-opening our services. These plans are in conjunction with the guidelines set forth by the Governor of Texas and the TX Department of State Health. It is still recommended that those over 65 and those in the "at-risk" category continue to self-quarantine. It is a time of personal responsibility and decision making. Also, anyone not feeling well, having fever or a cough, etc. are asked to stay home.

**May 10, 17, 24** - Morning worship services only, at 10:30A.M. This will be done with modifications to ensure distancing and hygiene.

**May 31** - Resume Sunday Bible classes. There will be only 2 adults classes. One will meet in the auditorium and the other in the fellowship hall.

**June 3** - Resume Wednesday evening Bible classes. All adults will meet in the auditorium.

For the first 3 Sundays (AM worship only), there will be a children's Bible hour provided during the preaching time for those 2 year old—5th grade. We recognize not all parents may feel comfortable with their children attending this. Again, we encourage personal responsibility and decision making.

The Livestream on Facebook will continue so that those who are unable to attend can participate.

We want to be together and at the same time be mindful of the concerns of others. This schedule is subject to change based on government guidelines and recommendations.
