before going to bed. One of her favorite things to do is going to Bible class (which she calls "tootoo class").






LET'S START TALKING

The LST parties are meant to promote interaction between the church and the LST students and also to provide the students with an opportunity to learn more about the American culture. 




BIBLE STUDY IN PORTUGUESE

CHURCH FRIENDS VISITING


• We have been quite busy having church family visiting us here in South Florida! We have loved their visits, nonetheless!

NEW VISAS

Still no news from USCIS about our visas. Please continue to pray.
In early April, the Village CoC received a letter from USCIS requesting some more documentation to be sent, which the church did right away. The new forms and documents were received by USCIS on April 22 and they have now resumed working on our case. According to most sites that I consulted online, we should be hearing back from them with a decision in a maximum of 60 days after receiving our response to their Request for Evidence (RFE).

• It is very likely that our current work permit will expire before the new visas come in. If this is indeed the case, we have planned to do the following:

We are allowed to stay in the US while we wait for a final decision from USCIS and that's what we want to do.

However, this means that we will no longer be able to keep working (once our work permit expires). We will also no longer be able to drive (because our driver's licenses will have expired too).

We are going to empty our retirement savings and live off that for as long as we can. The Village CoC will help us pay for our rent using their benevolent funds. We may have to accept some donations and if it comes to that point we will let you know.

We pray and hope that this will just have to take place for a short period of time. Once the new visas arrive, then the Village CoC will re-hire us and life will get back to normal.

In the worst-case scenario of us having our visas denied, then we will have to leave for Brazil as soon as possible. We are planning for that event and Joanna already has her American passport ready.



THE PANDEMIC

• The COVID-19 pandemic is a lot better here in Broward County. A great number of people have been vaccinated and the restrictions are being lifted.

• Too bad we can't say the same thing about Brazil. Brazil's numbers are still very worrisome and vaccination there is way behind. Most of our older family members have already received at least one dose of the Coronavac vaccine and we hope they will all be fully vaccinated soon.

• Both Tati and I have received the two doses of the Pfizer vaccine. We feel good and safer to deal with the public now. Being fully vaccinated also means it will be easier for us to travel to Brazil if we have to.

HELP DURING THE SUMMER

• In June we will have an intern from Harding University working with us. His name is William Robins and he is a Bible and Missions graduate like Maikon. William will be helping us with Let's Start Talking as well as assisting in other church activities.

• Also in June, we will have two church groups visiting and helping us organize VBSs for the children in the community. One of these teams is coming from the Netherland CoC in Rickman, Tennessee. Geoff Lopina (a former colleague of Maikon's in the CAMT/BMIN program at Harding University) is the leader of this group. The second group that is coming is from the Parkway CoC in Fulton, Kentucky. They're one of Mauricio Yegros's supporters.

• In addition, we're keeping in touch with Craig Altrock from Let's Start Talking and hope to have a team sent to work with us possibly in July or August.

TEAM FORMATION

• In our previous report we mentioned to you the Dawsons and their plans to move to South Florida and join in the work with us. For the previous few months we have had several meetings with Paul Dawson and some of our supporting churches to get approval and work on some details. However, Paul recently called me and alleged that, due to a number of factors, he and his wife have given up on the idea. We were sorry to hear this news but we pray God's blessings for them as they continue to work for the Kingdom.

• On the same day that Paul Dawson called to tell us about their final decision, we received a phone call from Brazil. It was Junior and Patricia Lira, from the church in Brasilia. One of our supporting churches (the College CoC in Searcy, Arkansas) has been helping with the Liras' support in Brazil for many years and they are now willing to sponsor this family to move to the USA and help us here with the work in South Florida. We're very excited with this news and pray God's will to be done in the Liras' plans!
