"Let Us..."

Thirteen times in the letter to the Hebrews the writer begins a statement with, "Let us .." Sometimes it's an encouragement statement. Sometimes it's a warning statement. Sometimes it's a challenge statement. In Hebrews 10:19-25, we have five of these "Let us" statements:

"Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place by the blood of Jesus, by a new and living way opened for us through the curtain, that is his body, and since we have a great high priest over the house of God, let us draw near to God with a sincere heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience and having our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may spar one another on toward love and good deeds. Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

This past week we looked at the first of these five statements, "Let us draw near to God". To you and me that seems obvious. However, to a first century, Jewish-Christian, the concept of drawing near to God was almost blasphemy. Under the old law, God made sure that the people realized that because of sin, there was a definite separation between Himself and man. The whole design of the Tabernacle and Temple was to magnify that separation. No one but the priests who were on duty at that particular time could enter the Holy Place. Ordinary Jews were relegated to the courtyard; and even priests who were not, "on duty" could not enter the Holy Place. And then there was the Most Holy Place. The place where the Ark of the Covenant resided. It was above the lid of the ark, the Mercy Seat, that God's special presence was manifested. Only the High Priest could he enter the Most Holy Place. And that was only once a year and only after sacrifices were made for himself and the people. You see, in essence the people were forbidden to "draw near to God".

Just like the mountain, as God descended to give Moses the Law, the people were forbidden to come close or touch the mountain for fear of being struck dead. But through the blood of Jesus, we have the wonderful privilege and blessing to be able to draw near to God with confidence! Wow! "Let us" take advantage.
