THOUGHTS ON TIME

Diamonds are valuable because of their relative scarcity. If they were as plentiful as sandstones, they would be worth no more than sandstones.

Time is measured out in very small increments. We have been given only one second at a time. For this reason it is imperative that we use very well the time that has been given to us. When we waste our time, we allow something very valuable to slip from us.

Even if we think in terms of a life span, still it is very short. The Psalmist prayed "Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain a heart of wisdom" (Psalm 90:12). I think that the prayer was not for the ability to precisely number our days but rather to know the brevity of life and then to use well our time. This statement is made in a context that talks about the shortness of life. For our days "quickly pass, and we fly away" (Psalm 90:10).

"Now listen, you who say, 'Tomorrow we will go to this or that city, spend a vear there, carry on business and make money.' Why, you do not even know what will happen tomorrow. What is your life? You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes. Instead, you ought to say, 'If it is the Lord's will, we will live and do this or that" (James 4:13-15).

In Scripture, some interesting and challenging figures are used to impress upon us life's brevity. Life is like a shadow, 1 Chronicles 29:15; like a flying shuttle, Job 7:6; like a hurrying messenger who brings the message and quickly moves on, Job 9:25; like the width of a man's hand, Psalm 39:5; like the vanishing midst, James 4:14.

The oldest person among us reflecting upon life will no doubt tell us that it seems but a short while. We do need to make good use of the precious moments given to us.
