"The Meek Will Inherit the Earth"

In our Sunday morning study of the Sermon on the Mount, we have been looking at the "Beatitudes", found in Matthew 5:3-11. IN these attitudes of righteousness we see two important truths. One, God expects us to have different attitudes from those we normally find in the world in which we live. And two, we see that God wants to bless us and has promised His blessings to us if we allow Him to instill these attitudes in our lives. In our study we passed over the third beatitude which says, "Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth."

Meekness is closely associated with the first two beatitudes: being humble before God and mourning over our sins. The world associates "meekness" with "weakness". However, that is not the case. The word used for meek is a word used to describe a wild animal that has been tamed; perhaps like a wild stallion that has been broken. The animal still has all its strength and power, yet that strength and power is now under control. Moses was described as a man of meekness, above all others on earth (Numbers 12:3), yet Moses was a great leader and filled with a powerful spirit.

God never calls us to be weak or timid. In fact, Paul tells Timothy that, "God did not give us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love and of self-control." (2 Timothy 1:7) That spirit of power, coupled with love and self discipline is, in essence, meekness. We are not called to be timid about right and wrong. We are not called to be timid about sharing the Gospel with others. We are not called to be timid about seeking personal righteousness in our lives and in the lives of each other.

However, it is when our spirit has been brought under control that we achieve meekness. It is when God's will rules over our will in our lives that we are ready to be blessed by God. It is also through meekness that we most effectively are ready to reach out to others with the Gospel. When we are brought under self-control (or more accurately, God-control) people will see a difference in us and be more receptive to listening to the Gospel message.
