"DO NOT LOSE HEART"

Paul will say in 2 Corinthians 4:1 "Therefore, since through God's mercy we have this ministry, we do not lose heart."

In Romans 12:4-8 it says "For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your[a] faith; if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead,[b] do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully."

Peter will say in 1 Peter 4:10-11 "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms. If anyone speaks, they should do so as one who speaks the very words of God. If anyone serves, they should do so with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ. To him be the glory and the power for ever and ever. Amen."

Praise God for the diversity of the church worldwide in order to server and glorify God. Sometimes others may not understand what you are doing or even why you are serving in such a way and this can discourage us; but remember again the talents God has give you are yours alone and by His mercy He is allowing you to exercise your gifts, therefore since it was God given never lose heart.
