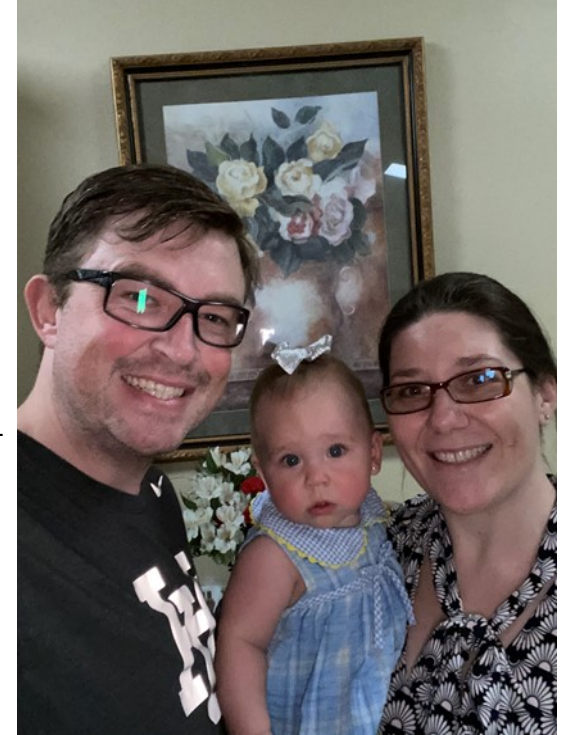

GOD'S WARNINGS

"See to it, brothers, that none of you has a sinful, unbelieving heart that turns away from the living God" (Hebrews 3:12).

The above warning is one of the many given in Scripture. Anytime a warning is given several things are suggested. First, it suggests a danger. If there were no danger, there would be no need for the warning. Second, the one doing the warning has knowledge that the one being warned does not possess. Third, the one doing the warning has a concern for the one being warned. Finally, the one being warned can prepare to avoid whatever threat may be impending. If there were no escape anyway from whatever might be threatening, the warning would be meaningless.

There is often as much love in a warning as there is in a promise. Warnings are often motivated by love. This is so as parents warn their children in the hope of securing them against certain threats. God's warnings to us are always motivated by love.

In the Bible passage given above God warns us against a sinful, evil heart of unbelief that would cause us to turn away from Him. The warning was given to Christians clearly showing that Christians can give up their faith and turn away from God. Jesus spoke of those who "believe for a while, but in the time of testing they fall away" (Luke 8:13). The Bible speak of those who "have shipwrecked their faith" (1Timothy 1:19).

We are constantly urged to be faithful. The crown is finally given to the faithful (Revelation 2:10).

It is important that we see all the love & concern which God has for us. It is also important for us to realize that His love is apparent in His warning to us.
