## "Blessed"

As Jesus started His "Sermon on the Mount", He began with what we have come to know as the "Beatitudes". Each of these begins with Jesus saying, "Blessed are the ..." The word "blessed" carries with it the idea of true joy and peace. Sometimes we lose the meaning when we place the Old English pronunciation on the word. Think of it in one syllable, not two. "blessed", not "bless-ed". (This works better in spoken language than it does in written!) Jesus is saying that by putting these beatitudes into practice in our lives, we will receive a blessing from God: a joy and peace that can only come from God in spite of circumstances and surroundings. It is more than worldly "happiness". The root of happiness is "hap", which suggests happenings and happenstance. Jesus is promising a joy that is from inside. A joy no matter what our current situation may be. A joy that is a spiritual blessing from God.

Look how Jesus uses physical terms and turns them into the spiritual: poor, mourning, hunger and thirst, etc. He is offering us spiritual blessings if we will adopt the beatitudes into our lifestyle. This Sunday, we will begin looking at the beatitudes. We will see how these qualities are another appeal from Jesus for us to be "**DIFFERENT**".

*"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.  
Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.  
Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.  
Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.  
Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.  
Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.  
Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called the sons of God.  
Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."*

**CONVALESCENT HOMES**

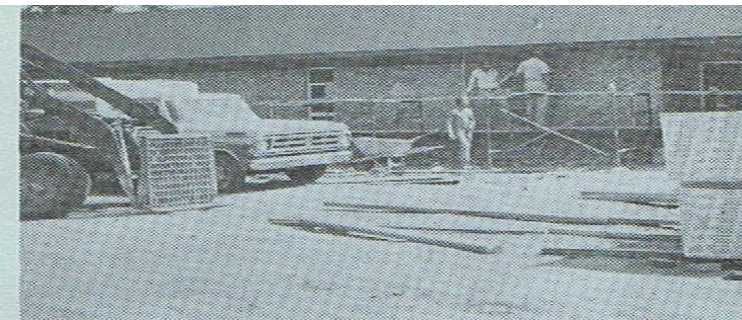
