"Jump As Far As You Can"

(A Little Encouragement Goes A Long Way!)

Several years ago when Brittney was in the 8th grade, I had been helping with the Jr. High track practice (probably more accurately, I was in the way!). I would help Brittney with her hurdles and then watch her practice the long jump. I was also a regular fixture at the track meets. When it was time for the long jump, I would help the girls get their marks and then right down distances during the competition so they knew where they stood in the standings. At one particular meet, as I was doing my usual job, one of the girls came up to me and said, "Mr. Gibbs, I'm not doing good today. Can you help me?". Well, knowing that I really didn't know the first thing about long jumping, I thought . . . then, in my best Knute Rockne imitation I said, "Try running a little faster and then jump as far as you can!". I know, not exactly a "Win one for the Gipper" speech, but to that little 7th grade girl, you would have thought that I had just assured her of an Olympic gold medal. She hung on every word and said, "Thanks so much!".

I recount that story, not to brag on my outstanding coaching talents, but to remind us all of how little it takes to encourage others. The New Testament is full of commands for us to encourage one another. And you know what? It doesn't take a degree in psychology. It doesn't take writing a long literary masterpiece. It doesn't take spending a lot of money. It starts simply by taking the time to notice. Notice a job well-done. Notice a sense of sadness. Notice a loss. Notice a difficult family situation. Notice an absence at worship. Just noticing is the first step to encouraging.

Then, don't worry about what to say or how to say it. Just say or write it. The message will almost always be conveyed. The love and concern will override any deficiencies in our words or actions. With time, I am sure that little 7th grade girl realized how lame my "coaching" was. But, at that time it was all I could do and it was all she really needed or wanted. So when searching for the "perfect" words, just remember, "Jump as far as you can" and you'll be just fine.

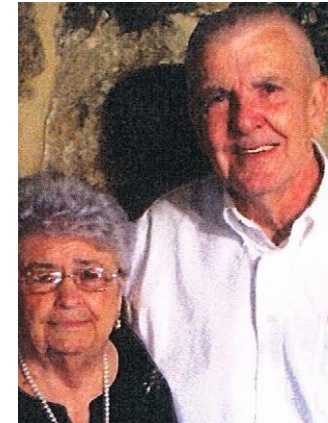


Franklin Gunn & Sarah Sprague were married on Saturday, May 23, in Daingerfield. Franklin is the grandson of our Edna Gunn.
