NONE OF SELF AND ALL OF THEE

"Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit" Galatians 5:24-25.

The last half of Galatians chapter five Paul is calling the brothers to live a life led by the Spirit and we are called to walk in the Spirit and be led by the Spirit. We can begin to understand here in context that the Spirit makes us aware of the battles that are around each one of us while in the flesh. I am thankful for the Spirit who leads us through these battles to the point that we can even produce the fruit of the Spirit.

Paul clearly gives us the reason why we no longer live by the flesh when he says that we have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. In other words, we no longer live according to the flesh but by the Spirit. It makes sense since, when we were baptized into Christ, we buried the old man and were raised to new life having our old self crucified with him so that the body ruled by sin might be done away with (Romans 6:1-6) and that we receive the promised Holy Spirit as a deposit according to Acts 2:38-39.

In other words, life is no longer about us, but about Him (Jesus) in our lives. Paul is an example of this in his own life. In fact, he is compelled by the Spirit to go up to Jerusalem not knowing what will happen to him. Have you ever been compelled by the Spirit to go and preach the good news somewhere? Have you ever been compelled by the Spirit to preach the good news to someone? Lots of times people ask, "what is the plan?" Look at Paul's plan, he says I don't know what will happen, and I know that persecution will come. We would probably then say why go. Paul would give the answer plainly that he was compelled (convicted) by the Holy Spirit even knowing that persecution would come. (Acts 20:22-24)

Perhaps we would ask "Why go?" if hardships are coming. This is where Paul puts into practice walking and being led by the Spirit. Paul understands it is not about him, but the Lord. He has crucified the flesh of wanting fame, power, the worlds false comforts, etc. He says his life is no longer about him, but about Jesus. He then goes on to say his aim to complete the work the Lord has given him. The Lord gave him the task of testifying to the good news of God's grace. (Acts 20:22-24) Praise God!

So how does this apply to us? We no longer live for self; we live for Christ being led by the Spirit. We should finish the race marked out for us, which is our life in Christ Jesus and walking in the Spirit. We make it our aim to let others know about the good news of God's grace being compelled by the Spirit. May we all get to the point as the song we sing "None of self, all of thee". Keep fired up, Mark!
