"In The Meantime"

This past Sunday we concluded our study of John 13-17. This recounts the last extensive conversation that Jesus had with His disciples. Jesus tells them that He is leaving and they cannot go with Him. He also promises that He will return to take them t where He is going. However, He explains that there will be an "In The Meantime". He spends the evening preparing them for this time. We too are "in the meantime". Waiting for His return, yet still continuing to live and serve until that time. Jesus' words on that night ring as true to us today as it did to those in that upper room so many years ago.

Jesus offers us words of COMFORT. He tells us not to be afraid. He tells us to trust Him. He tells us we are not alone. We can make it through the most difficult of times if we remember that God is with us and He alone provides us the strength, courage and peace to hang on to the end.

Jesus also offered words of WARNING. As Norman often told us, "There is as much love in a warning as there is in a blessing." Jesus warned us not to let go. He warned us to get along. He warned us to do as we've been told. These are warnings we need to take seriously as we help one another successfully navigate the "in the meantime".

Jesus continues to offer us words of ENCOURAGEMENT. He encourages by telling us that He is our friend. He encourages us by telling us that we have been chose. And He encourages us by telling us that all we have to do is ask. What an awesome thought that Jesus is our friend and has chosen each of us for service. And that He will give us what we need to fulfill that service.

Jesus ends with words of CAUTION. He tells us that when they hate us, don't be shocked. When they tempt us, don't be fooled. When they hurt us, don't let go. I am often surprised by the hatred and even violence against a system of beliefs that has at its core love for others, forgiveness and peace. I shouldn't be. Jesus said it was this way for Him and it would be this way for His followers.

We are "in the meantime": Waiting anxiously for His return and our realized hope of Heaven. Jesus words will ring in our ears and hearts as we live "in" this world, but do not become "of" this world.
