"Blessed are the Starving"

We have been looking at Jesus' introduction to the Sermon on the Mount. We call these, "The Beatitudes". Jesus begins each beatitudes with the same word, "*blessed*". Jesus is reminding us that there are inherent blessings to be found in allowing these characteristics to grow in our lives. The fourth of these is, "*Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.*" As the psalmist wrote about the deer panting for the water and our souls longing for God as in a dry and barren land, Jesus tells us that we should be starving for the righteousness that comes from God.

He is not talking about an occasional craving that can quickly be satisfied, but an ongoing hunger and thirst for being right with God. He would later go on to say, "Seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." He also goes on in this sermon to describe what this righteousness is. It is not an outward appearance or a righteousness defined by man based on certain acts. It is the inward presence of the Spirit of God that leads us to righteous thinking, to righteous motives, to righteous relationships, to truly righteous lives.

It is also a yearning to be led by God. A starving for His word. A starving for worship. A starving for fellowship with His people. Let us always be a starving people!
