"The Parable of the Stay-at-Home Son"

In Luke 15, Jesus tells three parables about lost thing: a lost sheep, a lost coin, and a lost son. The last has often been called the parable of the prodigal son. Prodigal meaning reckless according to Webster. We know the story. The younger son asks and receives his inheritance. He leaves home and wastes the money to the point he is left to feed pigs. He is so hungry that he wishes he could eat the pigs' food. Coming to his senses, he decides to go back home and beg his father to take him back as a servant. Upon his return, the father welcomes him with open arms, puts a robe and a ring on him and throws a party to celebrate his son's return.

What a great story. So many lessons we learn about God and His forgiveness. But really, that is not the point of the story. It's "a" point, but not "the" point. Going back to the beginning, we see that Jesus told these three stories in response to what had just happened. "Now the tax collectors and 'sinners' were all gathering around to hear him. But the Pharisees and the teachers of the law muttered, 'This man welcomes sinners and eats with them.'" (Luke 15:1

"The" point of the three stories was to rebuke the religious leaders for their attitude toward those who were coming to Jesus. Instead of joy, they were filled with indignation and selfrighteousness.

Enter the older brother. When he heard the commotion at the house, he asked what was going on and was told that his brother had returned and the father was having a celebration. The older brother refused to enter the party. He complained to the father about how he had been faithful and it wasn't fair that the irresponsible younger brother was received back with such joy. The father reminds his son that everything he has is his and it is only right to rejoice over the return of his brother. The story ends there without ever knowing if the older brother accepted this and joined in the celebration or not. If not, what a sad commentary.

"The" point is that we must always be open and joyful for any who come to receive the Gospel; no matter how we see them. God sees them as lost and needing to be found. Dead and needing to be made alive. If we are indignant and self-righteous, we too may find ourselves outside the great celebration.
