Looking into our Basketful

“They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over. Luke 9:17

It is still amazing when we read in the gospels of Jesus feeding the 5,000. You have the crowd that was with Jesus as He continued teaching them, the twelve disciples who had recently gotten back from being sent out and seeing the power of God working in their lives, and of course we have Jesus, the Son of God. We note the disciples noting that it was getting late and concerned about the size of the crowd and it seems imploring for Jesus to send the crowd away and Jesus answers telling them to give them something to eat.

I admit I probably would have answered like the twelve saying “we have only five loaves of bread and two fish” when looking at situation and circumstances. Praise God Jesus is willing to teach us and to show us to trust in God. Jesus puts his disciples in action by telling them to group the crowds and have them sit down. Jesus then takes the “only” food they have, looks up to heaven gives thanks breaks bread. The disciples then begin distributing the food. In the end, we know that the crowd eats until they were satisfied. The most intriguing part then is the disciples picking up the pieces left over and there were twelve basketfuls.

Can you imagine? Twelve basketfuls left over, and twelve disciples. Imagine each basket being in the hands of one of the disciples. What a powerful image? Each one was given a reminder right in front of them of the power of God and God took “only” what they had and turned in to being more than sufficient. What can we learn from this?

The twelve basketfuls remind us to always remember what the Lord has done in our lives and how over and over again He has done what we thought was impossible. When you look into your basket reflect on what the Lord has done in your life and the lives of others around you as you have brought their needs to the Lord. You may think in your mind “I only” have this or that and does not amount to much in helping others, but God can take what you have and do so much more than you can imagine; then you will have the basketful again to reflect on the power of God.
