We've maintained an average of 15-20 people who attend both in-person and online.

 A group of Harding University students from the College CoC in Searcy (AR) was here with us for their Spring break week. The College CoC helps sponsor our church plant here in Florida.

• The group, led by Grant and Kayla Fitzhugh, helped us with an array of different activities:

 On Sunday, March 5, Grant preached to us on our first weekly worship service. The other students helped during the service and the ladies taught the kids' classes.

 On Tuesday, March 7, we spent the day passing out flyers for our ESOL classes and Pastoral counseling sessions.

 On Wednesday, March 8, the group sang acapella songs at the clubhouse and we invited church members and neighbors to come watch their presentation. We also had a short devotional that night led by Junior.

- On Thursday, March 9, the group did some service projects and in the evening had a devotional on the beach.
- On Friday, March 10, the group led a fun evening of Bible stories and games for the kids and teens. In the meantime, the parents got to enjoy a romantic night-out at a Brazilian restaurant. The Borbas stayed with the College group while the Liras went out with the adults.

• On Sunday, April 9, we had a special worship service in which we focused on Jesus' death and resurrection.




### • LET'S START TALKING – ENGLISH LESSONS

 Junior continues to offer counseling and Bibles studies to the Coutinho family. He's also received several phone calls from people interested in pastoral counseling.

 Junior has been making himself available to help our church members with their emotional needs.

 On March 28 Junior attended a conference of Brazilian Pastors here in South Florida. It was a great opportunity to meet fellow ministers in the area and make some important contacts.



### • LADIES' MINISTRY:

 Tati has started a monthly Bible study with the ladies. They call it "Ladies' Bible Club."

Their first get-together took place on a Saturday afternoon, on April 22.
