Tuesday we celebrated the life of our dear brother Frank Blackerby. Frank was a very important part of our church family and we will miss him greatly. Only in his absence will we truly know how much he did in service to the Lord and all of us. After the funeral, I leaned over to Mark and commented that this was perhaps the easiest funeral I had ever participated in. It was easy because of the kind of man Frank was. He truly had a servant's heart and spirit.

From the moment he and Guan arrived here, he was always doing something. We were in the middle of building the new auditorium and he was here daily helping clean up. He soon was asked to be the deacon over the outside grounds. He took that job very seriously. There is no telling the thousands of hours he spent blowing off the parking lot, weed-eating, mowing, trimming hedges and much more. But he not only took care of the outside, he was the "go to" guy for inside stuff too. He would fix running toilets, change light bulbs, reset the clock in the fellowship hall when the electricity went out, and he tried to no avail to fix the drinking fountains. For as long as he and Guan were able, they attended Tuesday Night For The Master where he would run the vacuum during the clean up time.

Once he was unable to do as much physically, he took on the role of assisting Doug Mays with the church accounting and books. He was "old school". Everything was done with pencil and paper. He double checked everything and would not be satisfied until every item balanced to the last penny.

And on top of all this he was a true Bible scholar. As a young man he attended a Bible school in Kerrville, TX. He learned a lot there, but never stopped studying. In my sermon series, he was always reading ahead and would tell me each Sunday what I was preaching on before I preached it. We had lots of discussions and I appreciated his willingness to learn and change his mind, even at an "advanced" age.

And he was kind. His kindness spanned generations. His impact was felt by all. I can't help but read these words from Revelation and think they were written for Frank: *"Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on. 'Yes', says the Spirit, they will rest from their labors, for their deeds will follow them."* Rest brother, your deeds have followed you.
