“The Meek Will Inherit the Earth”

Jesus said, “Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.” Of all the beatitudes, this is probably the most difficult to really understand. Meekness is a difficult concept for us to grasp because we use the word differently than the Bible does. Meekness is closely related to the first two beatitudes: being humble before God and truly mourning over our sins.

The world associates “meekness” with “weakness”. However, this is not the case at all. The word translated meek was used to describe a wild animal that had been tamed. For example a horse that had been “broken”. The horse still has all his strength and power, yet that strength and power are under control. Moses was described as a man of meekness, above all others on earth (Numbers 12:3), yet Moses was a great leader and filled with a powerful spirit.

God never calls us to be weak or timid. In fact, Paul tells Timothy that, “*God has not given us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love and of self-discipline.*” (2 Timothy 1:7) That spirit of power coupled with love and self-discipline, is, in essence, meekness. We are not called to be timid about right and wrong. We are not called to be timid about sharing the Gospel with others. We are not called to be timid about seeking personal righteousness in our lives and in the lives of others.

However, it is when our spirit has been brought under God’s control that we achieve meekness. It is when God’s will rules over our will in our lives that we are ready to be blessed by God. It is also through meekness that we most effectively are ready to reach out to others with the Gospel. When we are brought under self-control (more accurately “God-control”) people will see a difference in us and be ready to listen to the message of Christ.
