"Yes, God is Good"

The Bible says that, "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like the shifting shadows." (James 1:17)

One of the tricks of Satan is to try to convince us that the Heavenly Father does not really love and care for us. In his conversation with Eve, Satan suggested that God was really just trying to deprive her of something good that would make her wise (Genesis 3:5). From that day until this, Satan has sought to cause the world to question the loving care and goodness of God.

Why is Satan so interested in having us doubt God's goodness? The answer is obvious. The apostle Paul taught that the goodness of God leads to repentance (Romans 2:4). We turn to God in response to His goodness. The apostle John wrote that, "We love because He first loved us" (1 John 4:19). If Satan can convince us that God is not good then the attractiveness of that goodness will not occur to us.

Perhaps Satan is successful in his approach because you and I do not always have a clear concept of what is good. We are apt to think that good is getting everything that we want. But God is interested in what is genuinely best for us. He may withhold certain things that we want or may allow us to experience things that we do not now like. This is so because God is interested in our training and discipline and in what is best for us in the long run. We must remember that, "We have all had human fathers who disciplined us and we respected them for it. How much more should we submit to the Father of our spirits and lives!" (Hebrews 12:9). The heavenly Father always disciplines us, "for our good that we may share in His holiness" (Hebrews 12:10).

The passage from James quoted at the outset teaches several important lessons. God gives only good gifts. If it comes from God, it is good. Paul was given a thorn in the flesh. It seemed a strange gift but it was good because it turned into a great blessing (2 Corinthians 12:7-10). God gives constantly. James wrote that the good and perfect gifts keep on coming down. They keep on coming even when we don't see them. God is dependable. He, "does not change like shifting shadows".

Yes, God is good. All that is really good in our lives are gifts from God.
