### "Jesus Reached out and Touched The Man"

It is perhaps one of the most insightful statements in all the Bible. It says so much about Jesus and His approach to people. In Mark chapter one, Jesus is approached by a man with leprosy. Under the Law, this man had become a social outcast—outcast from his family, from his friends, from his community, from the life he once knew. He had a horrible disease that was evident to all: the scabs, the sores, the deterioration of his flesh, his fingers and toes falling off, etc. The an could not even walk around the city without proclaiming himself, "Unclean!", so that others could avoid contact with him. Yet, he approaches Jesus and falls to his knees and begs Jesus to heal him. That, in and of itself, is remarkable, but what happen next is truly amazing.

The scriptures tell us that, "Jesus reached out His hand and touched the man". Think about that ... He touched him. He didn't have to. Jesus could have ignored him. Jesus could have rebuked him for breaking the Law. Even in healing him, He could have chosen to do it differently. Jesus could have simply spoken and healed him. He could have sent him to some pool or river to be healed. Jesus could have sent him away and healed him from a distance. But He didn't. He touched him. Jesus wasn't worried about catching leprosy. He wasn't worried about ruining His reputation or having to explain Himself to His critics. He simply reached out and touched him. Perhaps Jesus understood that at that moment the touch was as important as the healing. The touch showed compassion. The touch showed acceptance. The touch showed Jesus' willingness to become involved in the man's life and pain and disease.

There is a lesson for us. Whom are we willing to touch? Those who look like us? Those who have cleaned themselves up first? Those we deem, "touchable"? All around us everyday we come into contact with those who are suffering, those hurting, those in need of being healed. Do we give the impression of being approachable as Jesus did? Would people feel comfortable asking us for help? Do we act like someone willing to touch

We might get dirty. We might have our reputation challenged. We might have to answer critics. But if we are going to be Christ-like, then we must truly be Christ-like. We must reach out and touch others. Touch their hearts. Touch their lives. Touch their souls with compassion and love. Thank God He was willing to reach down and touch us.
