“But the Greatest of these is Love”

This past week, events in El Paso and Dayton reminded us again of the hatred and violence that is in our world. Lives lost. Families destroyed. Bodies injured. Communities in mourning. As with all such tragedies, debate begins as to the cause and prevention of such senseless acts. These debates, I suppose, are inevitable if not necessary. The world seeks answers and solutions to such events. And while it may find temporary or inadequate answers in laws and politics, our society does not realize that the answer is ultimately found in the love of God.

The apostle Paul tells us that love is the greatest quality in life (1 Corinthians 13:13). He also tells us that love binds all the other virtues together (Colossians 3:14). Jesus told us that love for God and others are the foundation of all other commandments (Matthew 22:37-39). Our world understands that we need more kindness and civility and understanding. What it doesn't understand is that it is only through the love of God that these qualities rise to their ultimate potential and power.

John tells us, *“This is love: not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins”* (1 John 4:10). John also reminds us that it is us, as Christians, who are the medium through which God's love is shared and spread. *“If we love one another, God lives in us and His love is made complete in us”* (1 John 4:12). Not many, if any, of us has the influence to change the world, our country or even our state. But each of us has the influence to change the world around us. By displaying the love of God in our homes and schools and neighborhoods and communities, that love has the power to change lives.

God's love that is displayed by our words and actions through kindness and service is more powerful than any law passed in Washington or Austin. If we can impact lives by living out the love God has shown us, then we can share with them the love God has for them too. We can show them and teach them of the extent of God's love in giving His Son for their salvation. And as we reach more and more people with God's love, that love will begin to penetrate into the fabric of our society and things can be different. I encourage us to think big, but start small. How can you show God's love today? Tomorrow? How can you impact the lives of your family, friends and even total strangers by making God's love complete? We have the solution; will we share it with others?
