# "Running From God"

We all know the story. God tells His prophet, Jonah, to go and preach to the wicked city of Nineveh. Instead, Jonah decides to hop a boat to Tarshish, which is in the opposite direction. A raging storm ensues and the sailors are terrified. They find Jonah asleep below the deck and wake him. When it is determined that he is the cause of their predicament, they throw him overboard where God prepared a "great fish" to swallow him. He stays in the belly of the fish for 3 days and nights. On the very few occasions when I misbehaved as a child (no comment!), my parents would send me to my room, but this brings a whole new meaning to "time out"! Eventually, Jonah listens to God and goes to Nineveh and preaches.

I look at this story and wonder, "What was Jonah thinking?" Did he really think he could run from God and hide? Did he really think he could get far enough away that God would forget about him and leave him alone? Whatever the reasons, it boils down to this: Jonah didn't want to do what God said. I think many people are still trying to run from God. They may not hop a boat or plane and try and hide from God. But they run just the same. They stay away from worship. They avoid others from church. Perhaps they feel that God will just forget them and leave them alone.

But God doesn't forget or leave us alone. The message of Jonah is the message of redemption and a second chance. A second chance for Nineveh for sure, but mostly a second chance for Jonah. Like the father waiting for the prodigal son's return. God waits for us. Like the shepherd and the lost sheep, God searches for us. And like Jonah, God sometimes gets our attention in dramatic ways. The thing about second chances is that they are, what we make of them. Judas could have had a second chance, but he hung himself. Peter took his second chance and faithfully served God.

Are you running from God? Have you been trying to hide from Him? He hasn't forgotten you. He hasn't given up on you. He is trying to get your attention. Will you make the most of your second chances?
