"Inasmuch as many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the things that have been accomplished among us, 2 just as those who from the beginning were eyewitnesses and ministers of the word have delivered them to us, 3 it seemed good to me also, having followed all things closely for some time past, to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, 4 that you may have certainty concerning the things you have been taught." Luke 1:1-4

"30 Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; 31 but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name." John 20:30-31

God bless each one of you in your daily walk with the Lord. God has given us His Word to lead us into His good, pleasing, perfect will and we are called to have the same attitude of Christ Jesus, called to imitate Christ, and to be Christ's representatives while here on this earth by shining our lights. It is so important that we have the desire to want to know Christ and know what He taught and how He walked among us. The encouragement for this week is to read the gospels. The gospel is the good news about Jesus; his death, his burial, his resurrection and the life He lived among us.

Reading the gospels (thinking of Luke and John verses at the above) produces faith and confidence in what we believe about Jesus and how He walked among us. In fact, we see in the gospel of Luke and in the gospel of John the expressed purpose of writing was to know the certainty of the things that had been taught about Jesus and that through the gospel that produces faith that believes that Jesus is the Christ and in Him we have life.

Matt. 1:1—"The book of the genealogy of Jesus Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham."

Mark 1:1 "The beginning of the gospel/good news of Jesus Christ/the Messiah, the Son of God."

Matthew and Mark points us to Jesus right away in their gospels. Matthew uses many of the Old Testament prophecies explaining that Jesus is the Christ and uses the genealogy to show that Jesus is linked to the promises and the covenants made throughout the Old Testament. It is great to know that Jesus fulfills the prophecies about the coming Messiah. Jesus will in fact ask his disciples who the crowds say He is. Mark starts immediately with the words the good news of Jesus the Messiah, the Son of God. His gospel reminds us of the power of Jesus as the Christ, and you can read over and over again through the miracles the word immediately.

In the end of the gospels, it calls us to share what we have learned through the reading of the gospel. Matthew says in 28:18-20 "Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Mark 16:15-16 says "He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation. 16 Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned." Luke 24:45-52 says go wait in Jerusalem and receive your mandate that is in Acts which is to preach the gospel in Jerusalem, Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.

So, in the end, let us read the gospels to know Jesus better and to share the good news of the gospel with those around us. God bless you and keep fired up! Mark


MEMORIAL FOR DEAN TAPPARO


