- To us, the greatest blessing has been to be able to help our home church in southern Brazil. We've helped them host their Sunday worship services via Zoom and started attending church with them every week. It has been such a wonderful experience as we miss our church family there so much.
- Since May 5, Tati has helped host and organize a Zoom meeting with several sisters from Brazil. They are watching and discussing the series on Jesus "The Chosen." We highly encourage you to watch it because it is simply amazing! Just download the "The Chosen" app on your phone. The episodes are available for free!
- On May 10, Mr. Howard Norton (former missionary to Brazil) preached virtually in our Zoom worship service with the church in Novo Hamburgo. At one point we had 48 devices connected with an attendance of over 100 people!
- Sundays have particularly become very spiritual days in the sense that we have been involved in so many church-related activities: At 8 AM we attend church via Zoom with the church in Novo Hamburgo; at 10:30 AM we watch the Daingerfield CoC worship service via Facebook Live; at 4:30 PM we attend our small group with the Cloverdale CoC; and in the evening we watch the Cloverdale CoC worship service, which is pre-recorded and made available on YouTube.









GOODBYE SEARCY:

- Leaving Searcy was intense and definitely not easy!
- On May 19, our Cloverdale church family and HU friends threw us a drive-by farewell parade!!! We were truly overwhelmed with the dozens of families that showed up to say goodbye to us. PREPARATION PHASE FOR SOUTH FLORIDA:

- Our plan still is to be ready to move to South Florida at the end of the year. However, because of the Covid-19 pandemic, things are a little up in the air and we will be playing by ear as things develop.
- Yee Haw!! For the summer months we will be living in Northeast Texas! We will be working with one of our supporting churches, the Daingerfield CoC. We have known this congregation since 2010, as they were the sponsoring church to the White family (who were missionaries in our state capital). We have strengthened our relationship with the Daingerfield church ever since and they became one of our main supporters as we were students at Harding.
- In Daingerfield, Maikon will be helping with the Youth Group and also teaching lessons and preaching once or twice a month.
- From about August to November we will be living in Hot Springs Village, AR. The Village CoC is our sponsoring church and we will be developing and strengthening bonds with the congregation which will be overseeing us, not only financially but also, and most importantly, spiritually.
- During the next few months, as the circumstances allow, we are planning one or two survey trips to South Florida to explore the area a little more, make some more contacts, and look at neighborhoods and houses.
