THE WORDS THAT WE SPEAK

There is a saying that sticks and stones may break our bones but words can't hurt us. That is just not true. Sometimes wounds inflicted on us by words are more painful than physical wounds.

The sins of the tongue are many, and the temptation to misuse the tongue is ever-present. We are warned in Scripture to be very careful in the things we say. We must put from us all bitterness and evil speaking (Ephesians 4:31). We are not to speak evil of each other (James 4:11).

Some people seem proud of their sharp-tongued tendency to tell it like it is. It is important to remember that they may simply be telling it like they think it is and not the way it really is. Even if that is the way it is, it may not always need to be told. If it is told at all, it must be told the right way and for the right reasons.

There seems little doubt that we sometimes use the tongue to deliberately inflict pain on other people. It has long been that some people attempt to build themselves up by cutting others down. The tongue is often the instrument used to cut people down. Even when there is no intent to hurt others, we may simply be entirely too careless in what we say and the way we say it.

Words can serve a very useful purpose—"Pleasant words are a honeycomb, sweet to the soul and healing to the bones" (Proverbs 16:24). "A word aptly spoken is like apples of gold in settings of silver" (Proverbs 25:11).

Finally we must give an account for what we say. "For by your words you will be acquitted, and by your words you will be condemned" (Matthew 12:37).

Jesus is our example for the way we should talk. When the people heard him speak, they were amazed "at the gracious words that came from his lips" (Luke 4:22).

Gracious words-beautiful words that help and heal. Let these be the words that we speak.
