To the elders among you, I appeal as a fellow elder and a witness of Christ's sufferings who also will share in the glory to be revealed: 2 Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, watching over them—not because you must, but because you are willing, as God wants you to be; not pursuing dishonest gain, but eager to serve; 3 not lording it over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock. 4 And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that will never fade away.

5 In the same way, you who are younger, submit yourselves to your elders. All of you, clothe yourselves with humility toward one another, because,

"God opposes the proud

but shows favor to the humble." [a]

6 Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that he may lift you up in due time. 7 Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you. 1 Peter 5:1-7

"Clothe yourselves with humility"

It is great to see how Peter wants to end his message to the churches in the province of Asia encouraging the elders and the church of the key for working together. Peter as a fellow elder can certainly give a great perspective to the elders for he knows the joy and surely the hardships. It is great to see how Peter has grown in his own faith. Remember that he and the other disciples at one time were contemplating who would be the greatest, and Jesus teaches them from even that time that they would lead differently than the world by becoming servants of all.

What did Peter learn as an elder? That one who becomes an elder should be willing and eager to serve. God desires these kinds of servants. He also gives guidance for the elders to remind them of their challenge to shepherd the flock and to be examples for the flock. He also reminds them and gives them hope by helping them to remember the Chief Shepherd and the crown of glory that is to be received.

Peter also knew the challenge of those who are leading in the role of elders and is straightforward to the younger in the church by saying submit to your elders. Why? The Hebrew writer answers in chapter 13 verse 17 "Have confidence in your leaders and submit to their authority, because they keep watch over you as those who must give an account. Do this so that their work will be a joy, not a burden, for that would be of no benefit to you." How do we talk about our leadership? Are we a motive of joy?

There is one simple key to having a great relationship among the elders and the church and Peter gives it in verses 5-7. The key is HUMILITY. In fact, Peter says all of us should be clothed with humility and also if you have any anxieties in this life, be it about your brother or sister, be it about the church; Continue to lift one another up in prayer and humility for God cares for you! DEVO SUNDAY

During Bible class time!

IT DOES MATTER: Jesus said, "If you love me, you will obey what I command" (John 14:15). Love always expresses itself. Jesus teaches us that our love for him must express itself. Furthermore He shows us the manner in which this will happen. Notice that what Jesus said is not a command or an order to act. It is rather a statement of fact. It is the way it is. Those who love Him obey Him.

We are eager to obey because of all that He has done for us, and because we are convinced that He knows what is best for us.

Here is one of His commandments to us. Regarding the Lord's Supper and our participation, Jesus said with regard to the bread "do this in remembrance of me". With reference to the cup He said do this in "remembrance of me" (1 Corinthians 11:24-25).

The New Testament, as well as the early church history, proves that the day we call Sunday (the Apostle John called it "the Lord's Day" in Revelation 1:10 and is called the "first day of the week" in Acts 20:7) is the day when Christians meet to keep the Lord's commandment and remember Him in the prescribed way. It does matter.
