Thoughts on Thanksgiving from an Old Friend

As Christians, we know that every moment of every day is in fact, a time for thanksgiving. We are, however, in the midst of that season which is generally designated as a time of thanksgiving. If we pause, even once in a while to be truly grateful, that is no doubt a right step.

Gratitude must always be directed toward someone or some source outside ourselves. Failing to realize this makes what we call gratitude little more than self-praise.

The source of all true blessings is well known to us. The Bible says that, "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights who does not change like shifting shadows" (James 1:17). God is the source of all that is good in our lives, both tangible and intangible.

We commonly fall into the habit of thinking that the things that we work for every day and gain through our own personal effort are somehow of our own personal making. In such a moment it is well to ask some very important questions. Where do human beings get the intelligence to do the things that we regularly do? Where does the creativity come from? We dare not ever be like the nine ungrateful lepers. We will see the goodness of the Lord all about us. We will see and be grateful.
