Be A Builder-Upper

In 1962, Minoru Yamasaki, a Japanese architect, submitted a design for an office complex to be built in lower Manhattan, in New York City. The center pieces of the design would be two 110 story buildings. The complex would be called the World Trade Center. On August 5, 1966 construction began. 1.2 million cubic yards of earth was excavated; enough to extend Manhattan island and create the 92 acre Battery City Park. During construction over 10,000 workers were employed and 62 lost their lives in the process. Finally in December 1970, Tower 1 was completed, followed by the completion of tower 2 in July 1971. 9 years from start to finish. For 30 years the "Twin Towers" graced the New York skyline.

Then, on September 11, 2001, tragedy struck. At 8:46AM, American Airlines flight 11 slammed into Tower 1. 17 minutes later at 9:03AM, United flight 175 crashed into Tower 2. The city and nation was thrown into panic and disbelief as the two buildings burned. Then, at 9:59AM, the unthinkable happened: Tower 2 collapsed creating a huge cloud of dust and debris. At 10:28AM, Tower 1 collapsed as well, leaving an eerie void in the skyline. In 1 hour and 42 minutes the World Trade Center was reduced to a massive pile of ashes, dust and mangled steel. *9 years to construct, 102 minutes to destroy.*

We all know the power of words. We know how words can either build up or destroy. It all depends on us. We choose how we will use our words. James called the tongue, "a fire, a world of evil". He goes on to say the we, as Christians, cannot use our tongue to praise God and curse men. Paul puts it this way: "Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen." - Ephesians 4:29.01

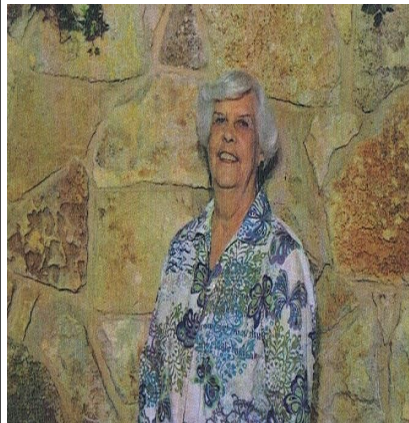

SUCCESSFUL WEEKEND!

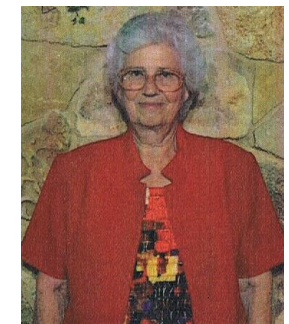
