"Discipline"

For the past two Sundays in our continuing lessons on "Family God's Way", we have looked at the importance of discipline in the lives of our children. Webster defines discipline as, "Training intended to produce a specified character or pattern of behavior". Discipline is rooted in teaching. We teach them how to read or throw a ball. It is much more important that we teach them discipline in their lives. This will help them to be successful, not only in their earthly lives, but their spiritual lives as well. James Dobson said, "Discipline is something we do for a child, not to a child". In chapter 12, the writer of Hebrews tell us that God disciplines us as a good father does. He says that discipline is a part of the love we have for our children. Proverbs 19:18 says, "Discipline your son, for in that there is hope; do not be party to his death".

Without discipline, our children do not learn that there are absolute right and wrongs in life. They never learn that there is a higher authority than their wants and wishes. Discipline begins with communicating our expectations to our children. We should teach them early that we expect certain behaviors and actions from them. We also communicate our expectations by our own examples as well. Good discipline means consistent discipline. If we allow a child to get away with something one time, but not another, we confuse them and instill within them a sense of rebellion or resentment. As parents, we must be committed to discipline. Raising children is not for the weak or faint of heart. It takes strength, time and commitment. Children will wear us down and wear us out if we allow them to. We cannot "give in" just because we are tired or frustrated. We can offer explanations where appropriate, but there does come a time where discussion must come to an end. It is okay to say, "Because I said so!". We are the parents! Discipline also takes cooperation from both parents. They need to portray an undivided front and not allow children to "divide and conquer".

And lastly, there must be consequences to inappropriate behavior. Consequences should be measured and appropriate. When open defiance and outright disobedience are shown, the consequences should be harsh enough to teach a lesson.

The goal of discipline is to instill self-discipline. Through our discipline, our children will learn to respect authority and ultimately accept the authority of God in their lives. So let us all as parents (and grandparents) commit ourselves to the task of teaching discipline to our children.
