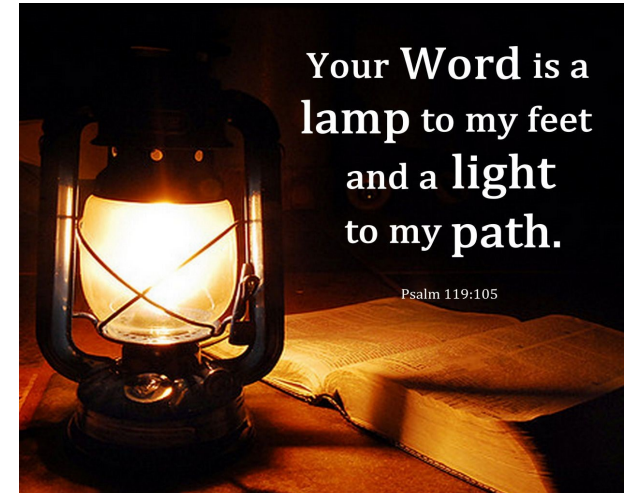

Psalm 119 is the longest chapter in the Bible and is almost exclusively devoted to our relationship to the Word of God. The Bible is one of God's most incredible miracles. It was written over a span of more than 2,000 years with 40 different authors. Yet, through the inspiration and providence of God, it follows a unified and coherent theme: God's journey to redeem mankind back to Himself.

The Bible has faced many trials and hardships. Not many years ago, people were executed for translating the Word of God into modern languages. It was considered heretical for anyone but the "clergy" to have access to and read the Bible. Now, it can be found almost anywhere, whether in print or electronically.

Bu just having access to God's Word is not enough. In Psalm 119, the author uses at least 30 different words to describe what our relationship to the scriptures should be: Joy, trust, hope, meditate, just to name a few. But the one word used most often is "obey".

Jesus said that those who heard His words, "and put them into practice" were like the man who built his house on a rock. Jesus also said that we were his friends if we, "do what he commands." James reminds us that it is not enough to hear the word of God, but we must, "do what it says".

Yes, the Bible is remarkable. However, it only brings joy, hope and promise to our lives when we obey it..
